

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

What is happening to the church? Numbers are shrinking. The people in the pews are getting older. Where are the young families? Where are the youth? Every year, more and more people are identifying as "non-religious". Congregations worry that they will need to close their doors.

After the Sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb.

The country is falling apart. Political divisions are tearing apart families and communities. Each side accuses the other of ruining America.

And suddenly, there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it.

There is war between Ukraine and Russia. China is threatening to invade Taiwan, and the United States might be dragged into World War III.

His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. For fear of him, the guards shook and became like dead men.

The climate crisis is getting more severe every year. There are droughts and wildfires and floods. Creation itself is plagued by sin.

But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here: for he has been raised as he said. Come see the place where he lay".

Refugees are streaming across our southern border. Most are poor families escaping drug cartels and crushing poverty. Some are drug couriers and human traffickers.

There are not enough border patrol agents or immigration courts to process everyone in a timely manner. And America is not the only country facing an immigration issue, as refugees are also flooding into Europe from Syria and Ukraine.

"Then quickly go and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you".

There is not a sufficient stock of safe, decent, affordable housing, and as a result, more and more people are homeless; living in a shelter, or in their car, or under a bridge, even in rural areas.

So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy and ran to tell his disciples.

Methamphetamines, heroin, and other opiates plague our streets and ruin lives.

Pain killers meant to heal are now being abused and causing harm.

It all seems so hopeless. To whom can we turn? In whom can we put our trust?

Suddenly, Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!". And they came to him, took hold of his feet, and worshipped him. Then, Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me."


When all seems lost, when it looks as though evil has prevailed and good has been defeated, remember that Jesus has given us a glimpse into the future-a future where God's justice reigns. A future where righteousness and peace prevail. A future where the forces of Sin, Death, and the Devil have no power. God's future breaks into our present. This is the kingdom of heaven. And even in the darkest times, God calls the church to help build a kingdom where God's will is done. Amidst all the evil in the world, when we look for Jesus, we remember the words of the angel: "Do not be afraid. The tomb is empty. He is risen".



29 But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?' 30Jesus replied, 'A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. 31Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. 32So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. 33But a Samaritan while travelling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. 34He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. 35The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the Innkeeper, and said, "Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend." 36Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?' 37He said, 'The one who showed him mercy.' Jesus said to him, 'Go and do likewise.' (Luke 10:29-37; NRSV)

In this passage, Jesus describes a Samaritan who was an outcast in the eyes of the Jewish community, but a neighbor in the eyes of God. Christ called him a neighbor because he showed mercy; the Samaritan gave his resources, time and energy to heal a broken life. Please remember your personal commitment to give your resources and yourselves to Christ; there are still people that need to experience the mercy of God through us.


