

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Last February, during the Super Bowl game, two television commercials were run by an organization known as "Come Near". This non-profit organization is funding a series of commercials about Jesus, titled "He Gets Us". Perhaps the commercial that generated the most buzz was one titled "Foot Washing', showing different people washing someone else's feet. Particularly poignant was a woman washing the feet of another young woman outside of an abortion clinic, with demonstrators in the background.

It is a clear reference to John 13, when Jesus, in his farewell discourse to his disciples, washed their feet, including the feet of Peter, who Jesus knew would deny him, and Judas, who Jesus knew would betray him. Jesus' point was in reiterating that disciples of Christ are those who serve one another, even people with whom we disagree on important topics. Jesus stressed the new Commandment, "to love one another as I have loved you. In this way, people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:34-35)

I had seen these ads before the Super Bowl, and I saw nothing in them that I believed to be heretical or contrary to Christian theology or Lutheran beliefs. Yet, I have seen posts, a few from conservatives, but mostly from liberals, warning that this campaign is some sort of trap: that they are trying to lure us in to supporting some kind of church or fundamentalist group; that they have an agenda of some sort. On their website, they address the issue as follows:

We have been accused of pushing our "agenda". We thought this might be the right time to make that "agenda" perfectly clear.

How did the story of a man who taught and practiced unconditional love, peace, and kindness; who spent his life defending the poor and the marginalized; a man who even forgave his killers while they executed him unjustly — whose life inspired a radical movement that is still impacting the world thousands of years later — how did this man's story become associated with hatred and oppression for so many people? And how might we all rediscover the promise of the love his story represents? Those are the questions at the heart of He Gets Us.

We've done a lot of homework on our culture. We researched how people feel about each other and what they think about Jesus and Christianity. We've connected with thousands of people of various faith traditions and those who claim no religion. We spoke to all kinds of people different backgrounds, beliefs, and, yes, political affiliations. And this is what we've learned: From politics to sexuality and religion, so many of us feel like our values, beliefs, and identities are under attack by the ideological "others" around us. Many perceive those who differ with them on issues of justice, dignity, and humanity as not just wrong or misguided but also as evil, as enemies. We often see these "others" as close-minded, selfish, hypocritical — and if we're honest, many of us respond in kind. The more we are willing to sacrifice things like kindness, patience, and the respect and dignity of others for the sake of victory — the righteous ends justifying the dehumanizing means. And it's tearing us apart. We experience it in politics, in the workplace, in schools, and even in churches. And at the heart of the conflicts is a fundamental disagreement about what it means to be good.

Throughout our shared history, Jesus has represented the ultimate good that humankind is capable of aspiring to. And though some no longer believe in God, most are still compelled by the idea of a person capable of unconditional love for others despite their differences. But many of us simply cannot reconcile the idea of that person with the way our culture experiences religion today. Whether it's hypocrisy and discrimination in the church, or scandals both real and perceived among religious leaders, or the polarization of our politics, many have relegated Jesus from the world's greatest love story to just another tactic used to intensify our deep cultural divisions.

How did we get here? And what might we learn from the example of Jesus to help move beyond the animosity we feel for one another? How can we rediscover the life and teachings of Jesus, the world's most radical love activist? That is our agenda at He Gets Us: to move beyond the mess of our current cultural moment to a place where all of us are invited to rediscover the love story of Jesus. Christians, non-Christians, and everybody in between. All of us.

I don't mean to sound like a politician, but I very much approve of this message. Some have criticized the money spent on the commercials as a waste of money that could better have been spent on helping those who are homeless or hungry. But doesn't that sound very much like Judas, accusing Lazarus' sister Mary of wasting money on costly perfume that she put on Jesus' feet?

Spreading the love of Jesus Christ, bringing people together instead of trying to drive us apart, bearing one another's burdens, and sharing Christ's love for all people, especially those who have been outcast and marginalized. This is the mission of the church, and it also appears to be the mission of the "He Gets Us" campaign.

Of course, there is more to the story. Jesus doesn't just "get" us. Jesus **redeems** us. Jesus buys us back from the forces of Sin, Death, and the Devil. Jesus **loves** us unconditionally. Jesus **saves** us, so that we might be in a reconciled relationship with God. Let's join with the people behind the "He Gets Us" commercials and spread that message to everyone we know. In the abiding hope of the empty tomb,

# **First Lutheran Severe Weather**

Designated tornado areas include—stairwells, bathrooms, basement,

first floor hallway.

If severe weather develops:

- 1. Proceed to designated area in the building—anyone who can navigate stairs go to basement; otherwise, go to one of the other designated areas.
- 2. Assist persons with disabilities.
- **3.** Stay away from windows, mirrors, glass, and unsecured objects.
- 4. Stay inside.
- **5.** A severe weather/tornado warning watch is issued when conditions are favorable for the development of tornadoes or severe weather in and close to the watch area.
- 6. A severe weather/tornado warning is issued when a tornado or severe weather is sighted in the affected area and people should seek safe shelter immediately.
- 7. At the FLIRT Meeting it was agreed that the FLIRT team will purchase a weather radio for the sound room.




