FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Are you the sort of person who makes New Years resolutions? I confess I gave up doing that a long time ago, because I would always become discouraged when I found that by mid-January, my resolution would already be broken. Every January, people pledge to start losing weight, exercise regularly, or quit smoking, only to realize by January 15 that it is not going to happen. Last December, I remember seeing a funny Facebook post about someone saying that their resolution for 2022 was to read the Bible in a year, and now, with one week to go, all they had to do was read from Leviticus through Revelation!

The first Sunday in the season of Epiphany is always the celebration of the baptism of our Lord. This year, it will fall on January 7. It is a time when we remember our own baptism as well. Baptism is not simply a nice little ceremony where we get sprinkled with water and officially made a member of the church. It is a recognition of the fact that because of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, we die to the old life of sin, and then are resurrected to a new life in Christ.

Paul writes in his letter to the Romans:

What then are we to say? Shall we continue in sin in order that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin go on living in it? Do you not know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore, we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his." (Romans 6:1-5).

While baptism itself is a one-time action, the struggle with sin is so great that we need to return to the waters of baptism every day, as we remember that God has made us God's own.

I recently read about a megachurch in South Carolina where 141 people were baptized in a single day. Eighty-six (86) of them had made the decision to be baptized weeks in advance, but another fifty-five (55) spontaneously decided to be baptized that same day. I am not sure what to make of such an event; especially about those fifty-five. While I would never say no to anyone wanting to be baptized, it seems to me that the decision to follow Christ is one that requires a period of study and reflection. It is a serious commitment to live in a way differently than the way the world tells us to live. It is not to be seen as a Willie Wonka-style "golden ticket" to heaven. Will these instantaneous decisions to be baptized result in a commitment to follow Christ? Or will it be a feel-good moment that, like a spur-of-the-moment New Year's resolution, will quickly fade within a few weeks?

Our commitment to live into our baptism is not one to be made lightly. It is not a pledge we are to make once in our lifetime at our confirmation, nor even once a year like a New Years resolution, but indeed every day. Like New Years resolutions, we strive to live into our baptism, knowing that we often fail. Thankfully, our salvation is not dependent upon us being perfect.

May 2024 be a year of joy and blessings. May it also be a year where we all commit ourselves to living into our baptism, knowing that we are beloved children of God.



A NEW BIBLE CLASS-CIVIC LIFE AND FAITH

(postponed from December)

Render unto Caesar that which is Caesar's. And render unto God that which is God's.

Luke 20:25.

Should congregations take a stand for or against political issues? Should churches be in the business of political advocacy? How do we discuss political issues in ways that build up, and not tear down, the Body of Christ?

The ELCA is developing a social statement on Civic Life and Faith, the relationship of church and state and related matters, as called for by the 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly.

Social statements are the ELCA's primary documents to address significant social issues. They are intended to aid reflection and shape conscience and to set forth the ELCA's teaching and policy on the major social issues and questions of contemporary life.

An ELCA task force provides primary leadership for the statement's development over a five-year period, using an established process of study and widespread participation in theological and moral deliberation.

The task force is now offering a six-session study curriculum for use throughout our church. It provides a guide into the issues and invites participant feedback for the task force.

The six sessions delve into these questions:

How is God's invitation to discipleship lived out in a democracy?

How do Christians address controversial civic issues?

What are Lutheran views on civic life?

What are the objectives of Democracy in the United States?

What's faith-based living got to do with civic life?

How do we go in peace to love and serve the Lord in civic life?

Two opportunities to participate: Monday afternoon at 1:30 p.m., beginning Monday, January 8 and Tuesday evenings at 7 p.m., beginning Tuesday, January 9.
