#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In the Lutheran Church, as well as the Catholic Church and most mainline Protestant denominations, the church year can be divided into two halves. The first half is the festival time: consisting of the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, and Easter, concluding with Pentecost.

June 4 is the beginning of the Pentecost Season, known in the church as "Ordinary Time". By "ordinary" we do not mean "regular" or "not special". It simply refers to counting-"Ordinal numbers" if you remember that term from your math classes. It simply means that we are counting the weeks after Pentecost. It is a time that traditionally focuses on the miracles and the parables of Jesus. Ordinary time begins with Holy Trinity Sunday. What is the proper way to explain to a non-Christian what the Trinity is, without making it sound like we worship three gods? From a You Tube page called "Lutheran Satire" here is the transcript of a hilarious video titled "St. Patrick's Bad Analogies" (Edited just a bit):

Simple Farmer #1 (SF1): Okay Patrick, tell us a bit more about this Trinity thing.

Simple Farmer #2 (SF2): Yes, Patrick, tell us. But remember that we are simple people without your fancy education in books and learning and we're hearing about all of this for the first time, so try to keep it simple, okay Patrick?

St. Patrick (P): Sure. There are three persons of the Trinity: The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, yet there is only one God.

SF1: Don't get what you're saying here Patrick.

SF2: Not picking up what you're laying down here, Patrick.

SF1: Could you use an analogy, Patrick?

P: Sure. The Trinity is like water, and how you can find water in three different forms; liquid and ice and vapor.

SF1: That's modalism Patrick!

P: What?

SF1: Modalism, an ancient heresy confessed by teachers such as Noesis and Sibelius which espouses that God is not three distinct persons but that He merely reveals Himself in three different forms. This heresy was clearly condemned in canon 1 at the first council of Constantinople in 381 A.D. and those who confess it cannot rightly be considered a part of the Church Catholic. Come on Patrick.

SF2: Yeah, get it together, Patrick.

P: Okay then, the Trinity is like the sun in the sky where you have the star, and the light and the heat.

SF1: Oh Patrick, that's Arianism.

P: Arianism?

SF1: Yes, Arianism, Patrick, a theology which states that Christ and the Holy Spirit are creations of the Father and not one in nature with him, exactly like how heat and light are not the star itself but are merely creations of the star. That's a bad analogy Patrick.

SF2: You're the worst, Patrick.

P: All right, sorry. The Trinity is like this three leaf-clover here...

SF1: I'm gonna stop you right there Patrick.

SF2: Yeah, hold your horses, Patrick.

SF1: You're about to confess Partialism.

P: Partialism?

SF1: Yes partialism, a heresy which asserts that the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are not distinct persons of the Godhead, but are different parts of God, each composing one third of the divine.

P: And who confesses the heresy of partialism?

SF1: The first season of the cartoon program, Voltron, where five robot lion cars merge together to form one giant robot samurai, obviously.

P: I've never heard of Voltron.

SF1: Of course you haven't. It's not going to exist for another 1500 years now Patrick.

SF2: Yeah, get with the program Patrick.

P: Right, I'll try again. The Trinity is like how the same man can be a husband, a father, and an employer.

SF1: Modalism again.

P: All right, then it's like the three layers of an apple...

SF1: Partialism revisited.

P: Fine! The Trinity is a mystery which cannot be comprehended by human reason, but is understood only through faith and is best confessed in the words of the Athanasian Creed which states that we worship one God in Trinity, and Trinity in unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the substance; that we are compelled by the Christian church to confess that each distinct person is God and Lord, and

that the Deity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit is One, equal in glory, co-equal in majesty! SF1: (after a long pause)... Well, why didn't you just say that in the first place, Patrick? Hope that gave you a good laugh for the day! God gives us everything, including the gift of humor. We may never fully understand the Triune God, but we continue to always give God thanks and praise.

### From the Financial Secretary

13 Someone in the crowd said to him, 'Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me.' 14But he said to him, 'Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?' 15And he said to them, 'Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions.' 16Then he told them a parable: 'The land of a rich man produced abundantly. 17And he thought to himself, "What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?" 18Then he said, "I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. 19And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry." 20But God said to him, "You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?" 21So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich towards God.' (Luke 12:13-21; NRSV)

In Jesus' parable, a man that society would typically laud as an agricultural genius was labeled by God as a fool. Why? Because the man's focus was inward toward himself instead of upward toward God.

As we move through this year, please remember our stewardship commitment of giving our resources and ourselves to Christ. For as taught by this text – God sends His blessings to us, so that others may be blessed through us.
