Easter, March 31st



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The season of Lent is a time when we return to our baptismal promises. It is a time where we are asked to seriously take a look at our lives and admit the sins we partake in that turn us away from God. As we prepare to celebrate Christ's resurrection, we are asked to make a commitment to repent of the ways we have turned from the Lord.

But what if, in so doing, we are so overwhelmed with the knowledge of our sinful nature that we fall into spiritual despair?

After all, there is no question that sin abounds in our world: mass shootings, political turmoil, war, famine, dictatorships, and other evils. It is so very tempting to throw our hands up and say "What is the point of working for justice and peace in the world? The evil we are trying to defeat is too great, and our proclamation of the Gospel seems so ineffective. What good can I, a sinful human being, accomplish?"

In July 1530, Martin Luther wrote a letter to his friend, Jerome Weller. Weller had previously lived in the Luther home, tutored his children, and was now struggling with spiritual despair.

Luther advised Jerome that the source of his despair was none other than Satan himself. Luther encouraged his friend to mock and despise the devil, rather than trying to argue with him. He also advised his friend to develop relationships with a Christian community and avoid being alone, "*for the devil watches and lies in wait for you most of all when you are alone.*"

The letter concludes with this powerful testimony:

When the devil throws our sins up to us and declares we deserve death and hell, we ought to speak thus:

"I admit that I deserve death and hell. What of it? Does this mean that I shall be sentenced to eternal damnation? By no means. For I know One who suffered and made a satisfaction in my behalf. His name is Jesus Christ, the Son of God. Where he is, there I shall be also."

Moses was a murderer. David committed adultery (possibly rape) and murder. Isaiah said he was a man of unclean lips. Peter asked Jesus to depart from him, for he was a sinful man. But God called all these people. The reality is that God knows our sinful nature and our weaknesses and calls us anyway.

Easter is coming. Easter is more than a celebration of an event that happened in the past. It is even more than a foretaste of our own resurrection in the future. Easter is the recognition that God has broken into our world in the here and now. It is the promise that God is working to reconcile not just humanity but all of God's creation to God. And God calls us to join him in that endeavor. The hard part has already been accomplished with Christ's resurrection. The devil has already lost. He just hasn't surrendered yet.

Yes, we are sinners. Yes, we deserve death and hell. What of it? Christ is with us. Christ redeems us. Christ reconciles us to God. Christ liberates us from the forces of Sin, Death, and the Devil. Christ is Risen. He is risen indeed.

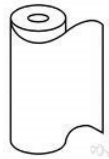
