#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I love watching the Olympics-both the winter games and the summer games. My favorite events are the swimming and the track and field events in the summer, and the ice skating and skiing events in the winter. If I were an Olympic athlete, I think the most agonizing time would be the few seconds of waiting after the time you step on to the swimming platform, or the starting blocks on the track, or the starting gate at the top of the mountain you are ready to ski down or waiting on the skating rink on the center of the ice. It's only a few seconds of waiting, but I imagine that it seems like forever; the athlete's heart is racing as he or she waits for the starting gun or the music to begin; to get the show on the road, as it were.

For the secular world Easter is over. The candy has been consumed, the Easter flowers have died, and the Easter decorations have been put away.

But for Christians, the season of Easter continues. In the church year, Easter is a 50-day season that begins on Easter Sunday (which this year was April 9) and concludes on Pentecost Sunday, (which this year is May 28). It marks the 40 days that Jesus was with his disciples after the resurrection, followed by the 10 days the disciples had to wait in Jerusalem before the Holy Spirit arrived on Pentecost. And I am willing to bet that the most agonizing time was the 10-day wait between Jesus' ascension into heaven and the arrival of the Holy Spirit.

I imagine the disciples staring up in the sky, watching Jesus ascend, and hearing the voice of the angel admonishing them: "What are you looking at? What are you waiting for? You heard what he said. Go to Jerusalem and wait. Now get out of here!" (I paraphrase). Ten days is but the blink of any eye compared to an average life span of 80 years, but like those few seconds an Olympic athlete waits before the start of an event, I would bet it seemed like forever.

Jesus is gone. The Spirit has not arrived yet. They were not told how many days they would have to wait.

When would it happen? How would it happen? THEN what were they supposed to do? After the Spirit arrives, how will they know what to do, where to go, or what to say? I had that "10 day" waiting period moment after I graduated seminary, and before I was called to First Lutheran. The five months between my graduation and my accepting a call here-those months seem fleeting now, but at the time, it seemed like forever. Where would the Spirit lead me? How long would it take to find a call? And after I got a call, THEN what was I supposed to do? No doubt we ALL have those anxious "10-day" waiting periods-the time between graduating college and finding a job, the time between the engagement and the wedding, the time between planning a new ministry and the start of it. It seems like forever, and after we land the job or say our wedding vows or start the new ministry, THEN what are we supposed to do?

The disciples need not have worried. With the arrival of the Holy Spirit, the disciples received the Spirit of God. They knew exactly what to say, where to go, and what to do, just as Jesus had promised. Did they make mistakes? Of course. And so will we. But the Spirit of Wisdom, the Spirit of Truth, the Spirit of Love, the Spirit of God, is with us. It comes to us in Word and in Sacrament; in our Baptism, at the meal of bread and wine that we share, and in the preaching of God's Holy Word.

May the Spirit of God always guide your path in your walk with Jesus.

If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and He will send you another Advocate, to be with you forever. This is the Spirit of Truth, whom the world cannot receive because it neither sees Him nor knows Him. You know Him, because He abides with you, and He will be in you.

We want you to know, brothers and sisters, about the grace of God that has been granted to the churches of Macedonia; 2for during a severe ordeal of affliction, their abundant joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. 3For, as I can testify, they voluntarily gave according to their means, and even beyond their means, 4begging us earnestly for the privilege of sharing in this ministry to the saints— 5and this, not merely as we expected; they gave themselves first to the Lord and, by the will of God, to us, 6so that we might urge Titus that, as he had already made a beginning, so he should also complete this generous undertaking among you. 7Now as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in utmost eagerness, and in our love for you—so we want you to excel also in this generous undertaking. (2nd Corinthians 8:1-7; NRSV)

In his letter to the Corinthian Christians, Paul references how the Macedonians responded to his effort to collect funds for the Christians in Jerusalem. Paul describes the Macedonians as people who had given themselves as well as their resources to Christ.

As we work toward the realization of the church's goal's, let us mimic the "Macedonian Mindset" in steadfastly giving our resources and ourselves to Christ. For how we give, serve and live not only helps to accomplish our objectives, but also serves as evidence of the resurrection. Our commitment to stewardship, like that of the Macedonians, is a testimony of the empty tomb.




#### HIGH SCHOOL
