FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Jeremiah 1:4-5: Now the word of the Lord came to me, saying "Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you. And before you were born, I consecrated you. I appointed you a prophet to the nations.

Psalm 139:13-14a: For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.

Luke 1:41-44: When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and exclaimed with a loud cry: "Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb. And why has this happened, that the mother of my Lord has come to me? For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy".

This November, Ohioans will be asked to vote on one of the most controversial social issues of our time. We will be asked to approve an amendment to the State Constitution that will guarantee that women have a right to an abortion up until the time the fetus is viable (that is to say, able to live on it's own outside the womb). After the point of viability, the state has the right to regulate or even prevent abortions, with the one exception being if it is necessary to save the life of the mother.

It is not my intention to tell you how to vote on this extremely personal and important issue, nor do I intend to tell you how I will be voting. But I do wish to provide you with some spiritual tools in deciding what you must do.

First, and I hope this is not too obvious: pray. Pray to God to let His spirit guide you in this matter. Pray for the young unmarried girl who got pregnant because she made a mistake and gave in to the pressures of her boyfriend who emotionally blackmailed her when he said: "If you love me, you will do this". Pray for the woman who already has three children and finds herself pregnant, even though she and her husband agreed they didn't want any more children. Pray for the couple who are desperate for a child and are medically unable to have one of their own, as they wait and wait to qualify as adoptive parents. Pray for the rape victim who finds herself pregnant by her rapist. Pray for the woman who finds that the father of her child wants no part of raising a child, and she is left alone. Pray for the couple who can barely make ends meet now and wonder how in the world they can possibly afford to have a child (or ANOTHER child).

Second, go to the ELCA homepage and look for the social statement on abortion. Although it is over 30 years old, it still holds up as a beautiful, nuanced, spirit-filled document. The basic argument of the statement is that, citing the above verses from the Bible and other verses, that God loves us and has plans for us even before we are born. Even unborn children are children of God. We seek to preserve life if at all possible. Yet we realize that in a broken and sinful world, terminating the pregnancy might sometimes be the best course of action; for women who find themselves with an unwanted pregnancy are ALSO beloved children of God, who need not only God's love, but the love of a community of faith.

No matter how the vote turns out in November, Christians must be committed to reducing the NEED for anyone to get an abortion. We must work to end poverty. We must work for justice and peace. We must work to make sure that everyone has access to birth control. We must encourage those with unwanted pregnancies to consider adoption. And we must work to build strong families; encouraging people to live by the church's ethic: Single people should be chaste, and married people should have intimate relations only with their spouse. If anyone cannot abide by that guideline, can we at least agree that we should encourage our children not to have intimate relations until they are adults? And if two adults choose to have intimate relations before they are married, to use birth control to avoid having or fathering children?

Finally, the church must never shame or cast out the woman who gets pregnant out of wedlock and finds herself alone. Instead, we offer love, support, help with food, diapers, baby clothes, babysitting, and any other need. And even if the woman decides that the best solution is abortion, we still do not shame or cast them out. Instead, we love them, cry with them, mourn their loss, and assure them that nothing separates them from the love of God.

In short, Christians are called to build a world where abortion is almost non-existent; not because it is illegal, but because it is unnecessary.

(Philippians 4:15-18; NRSV)

15You Philippians indeed know that in the early days of the gospel, when I left Macedonia, no church shared with me in the matter of giving and receiving, except you alone. 16For even when I was in Thessalonica, you sent me help for my needs more than once. 17Not that I seek the gift, but I seek the profit that accumulates to your account. 18I have been paid in full and have more than enough; I am fully satisfied, now that I have received from Epaphroditus the gifts you sent, a fragrant offering, a sacrifice acceptable and pleasing to God.

In this passage, the Apostle Paul commends the Philippian believers for their giving. What is noteworthy about their work is that they gave before others gave, and they gave when others would not give. What made the Philippians special givers? Because they had a heart for the Gospel.

In like manner, we encourage you to please continue to support the ministry; please ask God to give you a heart for the Gospel.
