FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Without a doubt, autumn is my favorite season. It has the best weather: cool nights and changing leaves. It has the best sports; college football, NFL football, and the World Series in baseball. And in church, it is typically a time of new beginnings. In many congregations, Rally Day celebrations kick off a new wave of programs and activities. But while we naturally focus on our own congregation, it is important to remember that in addition to congregations, Lutheran polity has two other levels: the synods, and the Churchwide organization in Chicago.

I wanted to update you about three major events going on at the Churchwide level of the ELCA. The first is one that hasn't happened since 2018 because of COVID-The ELCA National Gathering. In July of 2024, there will be another National Gathering for Youth who have completed 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grade in the 2023-2024 school year. **At a pizza party on Saturday,** September 9 at 12 noon in the church lounge, we will have our first meeting to begin planning Bible Studies and fund-raising events leading up to the gathering, which will be July 15-21, 2024 in New Orleans. (The actual event is July 16-20, but we are adding a day each way for travel). If you cannot make it on Saturday, there will be a second meeting with the same information on Sunday, September 10, immediately after the church service. In addition, if anyone is between the ages of 18 and 29, there is also a young adult gathering at the same time! If you could have gone to the gathering events that were cancelled by COVID in 2021 and 2022, and now you already graduated from high school, you can still be a part of the excitement with other young adults! If you have children or grandchildren in the age groups eligible to go, please invite them to attend one of the meetings.

My children both attended the Youth Gathering in high school and they can attest how life changing it was for them! I have now led groups twice, in 2015 and 2018, and it is one of the most uplifting experiences I have ever had as a pastor. I am reaching out to other congregations to discuss sharing a bus to New Orleans and rooming together.

A second major event is discussions concerning a new social statement: Civil Life and Faith. The statement will discuss the importance of religious liberty, the proper role of the church in relation to the government, and many other critical topics. After my first Bible class of the year is completed, (Luther 101), I will be leading a six-part study on this new social statement. The topics will be:

- How is God's invitation to discipleship lived out in a democracy?
- How do Christians address controversial civic issues?
- What are Lutheran's views on Civic Life?
- What are the objectives of Democracy in the United States?
- What does Faith Based living have to do with civic life?
- How do we go in peace to love and serve the Lord in civic life?

In our increasingly polarized world, it is vital to learn how to address civil issues from a Christian perspective, and especially to learn how to engage with one another in love. I hope you will be able to join me in studying this fascinating topic.

The third project has the potential to be the most life-changing in the lives of congregations: a Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church. Following the request for such a commission at the 2022 Churchwide assembly, 36 members from across the country began meeting in July, 2023

to develop a plan to renew the ELCA. The reason for this proposal was the great drop in the number of ELCA members and congregations (5.2 million members and 11,133 congregations in 1988, now down to 3.3 million members and 8972 congregations). I honestly have no idea what this commission is planning, but they need our prayers. More than simply growing our numbers, the goal of this commission should be to examine the ways in which the ELCA can live out it's mission-to make Jesus known in the world, and to fully live into the kingdom of God. I pledge to keep you updated on this commission's important work.

Autumn truly is an exciting time. I love the hymn we just sang last Sunday:

Classrooms and labs, loud boiling test tubes, sing to the Lord a new song.

Athlete and band, loud cheering people, sing to the Lord a new song!

God has done marvelous things.

I too shall praise God with a new song!


(John 3:14-17; NRSV)


THANKS to EVERYONE who made the Backpack Sunday a Great


