FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

We could hardly believe what we were seeing and hearing. It was July 13, 2024. Donald Trump was making a campaign speech at the Butler Farm Show Grounds near Butler, Pennsylvania. Suddenly, something that sounded like firecrackers rang out. We saw Trump grab his right ear, and suddenly the Secret Service was on top of him. The fireworks weren't fireworks at all. They were gunshots. Two people were seriously injured. One man, a firefighter, was killed. In just a few seconds, the gunman was killed as well, taken out by snipers in the Secret Service. Thankfully, Trump was not seriously hurt. But the Secret Service was called to account. This was the closest thing to a political assassination since 1981, when John Hinkley Jr. fired at Ronald Reagan. How was the gunman able to get so close? Congress convened hearings. Both Republicans and Democrats demanded answers. The head of the Secret Service accepted blame and resigned.

I spoke about the assassination attempt at the outdoor service the next day, on Sunday July 14. I did not express my thoughts correctly. As a result, I have spoken with people who were bothered by what I said. I spoke of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the Lutheran pastor who was sent to a prison camp in Germany, where he was hanged just a few weeks before the end of the war, because he participated in a plot to assassinate Hitler. To some people, my remarks made it sound like I was equating the two shootings and saying that both shootings were morally justified. That was not my intent, and it is certainly not my belief.

Bonhoeffer's case is clearly morally stronger. He had a legitimate justifiable argument for his actions. We were at war. Hitler's "final solution" was responsible for the deaths of millions of people. My point was that *even in Bonhoeffer's case*, many Lutherans are queasy about what Bonhoeffer did.

The man who shot at Donald Trump has no justification at all for his actions. None at all. Even if you believe Trump should not win the election, even if you think he was a terrible president, even if you believe that a Trump presidency would be disastrous for the country, Trump is no Hitler. And if anyone was disappointed that the shooter missed, that person needs a refresher on the Gospels.

The way of Christ is the way of non-violence. The way of Christ is to put away our swords, for those who live by the sword will die by the sword. The way of Christ is to love our enemies, and to pray for those who persecute us.

We need to be careful with what we say when we discuss politics and elections. We need to focus on policy, not on the personal. We need to stop seeing everyone on the other side of the political aisle as the enemy. It is perfectly acceptable to say, "I will never vote for Donald Trump" or, "I will never vote for Kamala Harris". It is NOT fine to say, "I hate Donald Trump" or "I hate Kamala Harris" or "I hate everyone who supports Trump" or "I hate everyone who supports Harris". Such inflammatory hate speech may have been partially responsible for causing that shooter to do what he did.

Remember the words of James, the brother of Jesus:

How great a forest is set ablaze by a such a small fire! 6 And the tongue is a fire. The tongue is placed among our members as a world of iniquity; it stains the whole body, sets on fire the cycle of life, and is itself set on fire by hell 7 For every species of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by the human species, 8 but no one can tame the tongue—a restless evil, full of deadly poison. 9 With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse people, made in the likeness of God. 10 From the same mouth comes a blessing and a curse. My brothers and sisters, this ought not to be so. James 3: 5b-10.

As Christians, we are called to be in the world, but not OF the world. The world may engage in political mudslinging, but as people who follow Christ, we are called to set a higher standard. We are called to engage in civil debate without hate. We are called to speak to one another in love, and of course, we are called to condemn all acts of violence. We are called to worship a Savior who died and rose again so that all may be saved by grace through faith.


The Chancel Choir will resume practice on September 5th.



But, we need volunteers! Please sign up to help us either in buying groceries, donating money to pay for groceries, help bag groceries or to help deliver groceries.



The overall purpose of the Logan County Weekday Religious Education Association, LLC is to provide a weekday Christian education program to guide boys and girls in an understanding of the basic truths of the Bible, without denominational bias.

Logan County WRE has been blessed to serve 3rd & 4th graders of Logan County, OH since 1955, and are grateful for our ongoing relationship with all four local school systems.

Through generous donations, Logan County WRE purchased its first mobile classrooms in 1974. They were replaced with handicap-accessible versions in 1998, and again in 2009. the newest classrooms are larger and equipped with ample storage and audio-visual equipment.

The program provides 3rd & 4th graders with 25-35 minutes of teaching about Jesus, the Bible, and the Christian faith, on a weekly basis. For many, this is the only formal Bible instruction they receive.

October is stewardship month, and this year, the stewardship committee would like to try something a little bit different.


Instead of taking pledges then crafting a budget, the plan is to try the reverse- present an outline of goals for the coming year, before we pass out the pledge cards.
